"The Fullness of God" Part II Ephesians 3:14-21

Intro:

In this prayer of Paul's there are 5 pieces that build one upon the other – leading to **Eph. 3:20** – *exceedingly abundance*.

- (1) Strengthening the inner-man
- (2) The indwelling of Christ
- (3) Incomprehensible love
- (4) Infinite fullness
- (5) Internal power verse 20.
 - The power to have that kind of life comes, only, when the Holy Spirit of God has control of my life.

Without the Spirit's filling, and without the Spirit's anointing there is no fullness, and there is no power.

Literally, the way Paul wrote **chapter 3:14-21** in the Greek, it's written as a clause wherein one thing happens, and the second thing that happens is contingent upon the first, and so on. *There's a progression*.
